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Hydro-Flow to Sponsor WWIF's 6th Annual Golf Tournament in Denver

Deerfield Beach, FL – February 1, 2018 – Wishing Well International Foundation's (WWIF) 6th Annual Golf Tournament is set to tee off at the Willis Case Golf Course in Denver, CO, on Monday, March 26 at 9a.m. Hydro-Flow Filtration Systems of Temecula, CA is the official sponsor of this year's tournament. Funds generated by these sponsorships will go towards the purchase of water filters for future deployments.



The tournament precedes the annual WQA Convention & Exposition. Manufacturers, distributors and dealers of water products from around the world will converge on Denver from March 26 to 29. This gathering of water treatment experts is what led to the creation of WWIF back in 2010.

Representatives of a handful of WQA member companies cast a vision to provide clean, safe drinking water to people in developing countries who can't afford to buy filtration products. Since then, WWIF has deployed hundreds of water filters in countries such as Haiti, Ghana, Japan, South Africa and the Dominican Republic. The most recent effort was the 10-1-10 Africa Expedition, in which dozens of filters were deployed across southern Africa in September 2017, which created a positive impact for 2,000 people.



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“Corporate sponsorships and individual donations make it possible for us to do what we do,” said Guillermo Guzman, CEO & Founder of WWIF. “When company reps see the need that is out there with their own two eyes, they are moved to action. Foundation officials are making plans for another deployment in 2018 with existing funds. Among other potential projects, they’re currently in conversations with partners in South Africa to determine how to help the people of Cape Town.
